This leaflet contains all you need to join in the service. Words **in bold print** are spoken or sung by all. Hymns are not announced. For visitors, Gift Aid envelopes are available for donations. It is our tradition be as still and quiet as possible before the service as we prepare together to celebrate the Eucharist.

When the bell rings, please stand to join in:

The world's fair rose has blossomed of Jesse's royal stem;
Foretold by ancient prophets, who did the news proclaim;
This blossom greets the light within our cold midwinter,
Upon our dark midnight.

This rose, I mean, whose coming Isaiah first did sing, Is Mary pure and blessèd, whose blossom is our king; By God's eternal will, this maid who bore her baby Is maid and mother still.

We pray you, Mary, mother, the world's fair Rose of grace, That by your Christ child's passion, we too may see his face; So may he help us all to offer as his treasure Our hearts, his dwelling-place. The president today is the Revd Jane Walker. Please remain standing for the greeting and act of penitence.

+ In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

The prayer to mark the lighting of the first Advent Candle is led by the choir.

Blessed are you, Sovereign Lord, just and true, to you be praise and glory for ever! Your prophet John the Baptist was witness to the truth as a burning and shining light. May we your servants rejoice in his light, and so be led to witness to him who is the Lord of our coming Kingdom, Jesus our Saviour and King of the Ages.

Blessed be God for ever.

When the Lord comes, he will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. In the light of Christ let us confess our sins.

A time of silent prayer follows, then:
Heavenly Father,
you have created a universe of light:
forgive us when we return to darkness.
you are the light of the world:
cleanse and heal us from our sins,
give us light in our hearts
and renew us in faith and love. Amen.

The Kyries are led by the choir.
Then the president says the absolution:
May almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy on us, pardon and deliver us from all our sins, confirm and strengthen us in all goodness and keep us in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

THE COLLECT: the prayer for this Sunday

Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer the president says the Collect. At the end: **Amen.**

Please sit down for the Ministry of the Word.

FIRST READING Isaiah 35: 1-10

At the end: This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

CANTICLE The Magnificat

My soul proclaims you, mighty God, my spirit sings your praise; you look on me, you lift me up, and gladness fills my days.

All nations now will share my joy, your gifts you have outpoured, your little one you have made great-I magnify my God.

For those who love your holy name, your mercy will not die; your strong right arm puts down the proud

and lifts the holy high.

You fill the hungry with good things, the rich you send away; the promise made to Abraham is filled to endless day.

Magnificat, magnificat, magnificat praise God! Praise God, praise God, praise God, magnificat, praise God

SECOND READING James 5.7-10

Be patient, therefore, beloved, until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains.

You also must be patient. Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near. Beloved, do not grumble against one another, so that you may not be judged. See, the Judge is standing at the doors! As an example of suffering and patience, beloved, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

At the end: This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Please stand to join in the Advent Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia!

Your words, O Lord, are spirit and life. Alleluia! Open our hearts to your word.

Alleluia! Open our hearts to your word. Prepare a way for the Lord, make God's pathway straight, and all the earth shall see the saving love of God. Alleluia...

GOSPEL READING Matthew 11.2-11

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Please sit down. The preacher is the Revd Richard Young. After the sermon there will be a time of silence. Then all please STAND with the president for the Creed.

We believe in God the Father,

from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named.

We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith,

and fills us with his love.
We believe in God the Holy Spirit,

who strengthens us with power from on high. We believe in one God;

Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayer of the Faithful. After each section:

Lord, in your mercy hear our prayer.

After the final section (for the departed) there will be a time of silent prayer. At the end: Almighty God, as your blessed Son Jesus Christ first came to seek and to save the lost; so may he come again to find in us

the completion of his redeeming work; for he is alive and reigns with you

and the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

Amen.

The president introduces THE PEACE: In the tender mercy of our God, the dayspring from on high shall break upon us, to give light to those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace: the peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

All exchange a sign of peace, then join in:

OFFERTORY HYMN 55

The bread and wine are brought to the altar. The president says a prayer over the gifts to which we all respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER follows.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

THE PRESIDENT continues the prayer, thanking God for his saving works, and then invites the people to join their praises with the whole company of heaven:

..... for ever praising you and singing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who
comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest...

THE PRESIDENT asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify the bread and wine, and then repeats the Lord's words over the bread and cup.
......Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

THE PRESIDENT CONTINUES, joining our offering with Christ's sacrifice of himself. At the end of the prayer the president says:

....all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever:

Amen.

The President introduces the Lord's Prayer and all say together:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory for ever and ever.

We SIT or KNEEL as the president breaks the consecrated bread in pieces for all to share:

We break this bread

to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

The president addresses those who wish to come to Holv Communion:

Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

Those who wish draw near to the altar. Those who are baptized, as well as communicant members of other Christian churches, are invited to receive Holy Communion. Others are asked to fold their arms for a blessing.

During communion the choir sings Comfort, comfort now my people..

When all have received Holy Communion what remains of the consecrated bread will be placed in the tabernacle.

A time of stillness and quiet follows.

Then please STAND with the President. Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer.
We give you thanks, O Lord,
for these heavenly gifts;
kindle in us the fire of your Spirit
that when your Christ comes again
we may shine as lights before his face;
who is alive and reigns now and for ever.
Amen.

Please join in:

Hark what a sound, and too divine for hearing, Stirs on the earth and trembles in the air; Is it the thunder of the Lord's appearing? Is it the music of His people's prayer?

Surely He cometh, and a thousand voices Shout to the saints, and call each listening ear; Surely He cometh, and the earth rejoices, Glad in His promise - for his time is near.

This hath He done, and shall we not adore him? This shall He do, and can we still despair? Come, let us quickly fling ourselves before him, Cast at His feet the burden of our care.

Yet, through life, death,
through sorrow and through sinning
He shall suffice me, for He hath sufficed:
Christ is the end, for Christ was the beginning,
Christ the beginning, for the end is Christ.

PLEASE SIT for the announcements then STAND for the blessing and dismissal.

Christ the Sun of Righteousness shine upon you, scatter the darkness from before your path, and make you ready to meet him when he comes in glory; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son + and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always.

Amen.

Go in the peace of Christ.
