This leaflet contains all you need to join in the service. Words **in bold print** are spoken or sung by all. Hymns are not announced. Please be as still and quiet as possible before the service as we prepare together to celebrate the Eucharist. When the bell rings, please join in:

#### **HYMN 114**

The president today is the Revd Jane Walker. The Eucharist begins with a greeting and short act of penitence.

+ In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed, alleluia!

Rejoicing in Christ's resurrection, let us turn to him with new resolve to walk with him in his risen life, and to turn away from sin.

After a moment of silent prayer:

Lord Jesus, you raise us to new life. Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**  Lord Jesus, you forgive us our sins.
Christ, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you feed us with the living bread. Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

A time of silence follows.

May the God of love and power forgive us and free us from our sins, heal and strengthen us by his Spirit and raise us to new life in Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

Glory to God in the highest. and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father. we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ. only Son of the Father, Lord God. Lamb of God. you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

**THE COLLECT** The prayer for this Sunday

Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer, the president says the Collect.

At the end: Amen.

The Ministry of the Word follows.

FIRST READING Acts 3:12-19

At the end:

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

PSALM 4



When I call, answer me O God of justice; From anguish you released me, have mercy and hear me. //It is the Lord who grants favours to those whom he loves; The Lord hears me whenever I call him.

"What can bring us happiness?" many say. Lift up the light of your face on us O Lord. I will lie down in peace, and sleep comes at once;/ for you make me dwell in safety.

### SECOND READING 1 John 3.1-7

See what love the Father has given us: that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now: what we will be has not vet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure. Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

At the end: This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Please stand to join in the Gospel Acclamation: Did not our hearts burn within us?

Alleluia! Alleluia!

As we heard the risen Jesus: Alleluia! Alleluia! Praise the Lord, praise his word, Alleluia, praise the risen Lord.

Come risen Lord, walk beside us:

Alleluia! Alleluia!

May your gospel ever guide us: Alleluia. Alleluia! Praise the Lord, praise his word, Alleluia, praise the risen Lord.

Open our hearts, risen Jesus Alleluia! Alleluia!

May your spirit never leave us. Alleluia! Alleluia! Praise the Lord, praise his word, Alleluia, praise the risen Lord.

#### GOSPEL READING Luke 24:36b-48

The Lord be with you

# And also with you.

Hear the holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

## Praise to you, O Christ.

Please sit for the sermon. The preacher today is the Revd Canon Alma Servant. After the sermon there will be a time of silence. Then please stand with the president for the PROFESSION OF FAITH:



We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named.

We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power <u>from on high.</u> We believe in one God;

Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Prayer of the Faithful follows.

After each section:

Lord, in your mercy

hear our prayer.

After the final section (for the departed) there will be a time of silent prayer. At the end:

Merciful Father.

accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, Amen

The president introduces THE PEACE:
The risen Christ came and stood among his

disciple and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then were they glad when they saw the Lord.
The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

All exchange a sign of peace and then join in:

#### **HYMN 104**

The bread and wine are brought to the altar.
The president says a prayer over the gifts to which we respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER follows.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president continues the prayer, thanking God for his saving works, and then invites the people to join their praises with the whole company of heaven:

......forever praising you and singing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The president asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify the bread and wine, and then repeats the Lord's words over the bread and cup:

.....Great is the mystery of faith.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

The president continues, joining our offering with Christ's sacrifice of himself. At the end of the prayer the president says:

.....all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever: **Amen.** 

The president introduces the Lord's Prayer and all say together:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil,

for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

The president breaks the consecrated bread in pieces for all to share:

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.

The president addresses those who wish to come to Holy Communion:

Alleluia.

Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

## Alleluia! Let us keep the feast.

Those who wish to receive the Sacrament or a blessing approach the altar. Receiving from the chalice remains optional. During communion we hear He is risen.

When all have received Holy Communion what remains of the consecrated bread will be placed in the tabernacle and there is a time of stillness and quiet. Then all please stand with the President.

## Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer.

Living God, your Son made himself known to his disciples in the breaking of bread:

open the eyes of our faith,

that we may see him in all his saving work; who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.

Amen.

#### **HYMN 121**

Please sit for the announcements, then stand for the blessing and dismissal.

May God, who through the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ has given us the victory, give you joy and peace in your faith; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son + and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always.

#### Amen.

Go in the peace of Christ, alleluia, alleluia: **Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia.**
