For visitors, Gift Aid envelopes are available. It is our tradition be as still and quiet as possible before the service as we prepare together to celebrate the Eucharist. When the bell rings, please stand to join in:

HYMN 76

The president today is the Revd Jane Walker. Please remain standing for the greeting and act of penitence.

+ In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Compassion and forgiveness belong to the Lord our God; let us then renounce our wilfulness and ask for his mercy by confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

A time of silent reflection follows, then: Lord God, we have sinned against you; we have done evil in your sight. We are sorry and repent. Have mercy on us according to your love. Renew a right spirit within us and restore us to the joy of your salvation, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. The Kyries are sung. Then the president says the absolution: May Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy on us, pardon and deliver us from all our sins, confirm and strengthen us in all goodness and keep us in life eternal;

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE COLLECT The prayer for this Sunday

Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer the president says the Collect. At the end: Amen.

Please sit down for the Ministry of the Word.

FIRST READING Genesis 15: 1-12, 17-18

At the end: This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

PSALM 27

John Bell's 'tango' setting!

Please remain seated and join in the refrain. The Lord is my light, my light and salvation; Who shall I fear, who shall I fear? The Lord is my light, my light and salvation; Why should I be afraid?

When the powers of evil move towards me, when my very flesh is under threat, when my enemies smell the scent of vict'ry they shall stumble and fall.

Should a might army camp around me, still my heart would register no fear. Though a war were waged - though it raged against me - I'd trust God and stand firm.

One thing through it all my soul is seeking to live all my life within God's house; There to spend my days, gazing at God's beauty while at one with my Lord.

God protects me in the time of trouble, shelters me yet sets me on a rock. Safe from ev'ry harm, safe from all that threatens I will sing and rejoice.

SECOND READING Philippians 3: 17 – 4:1

Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation so that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself. Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Please stand for the Lent Gospel Acclamation:



Praise to <u>you</u> O <u>Christ</u>, King of e<u>ternal glory</u>. **Praise to you O Christ**, King of eternal glory. Praise to you O Christ, King of eternal glory.

GOSPEL READING Luke 13: 31-35

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord.** *At the end:*

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.** Please sit down for the sermon. The preacher today is the Revd Canon Alma Servant. After the sermon there will be a time of silence. Then all please STAND with the president for the Creed. We believe in one God.

the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures: he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen. Please remain standing for the Prayer of the Faithful. After each section:

Lord, in your mercy

hear our prayer.

After the final section (for the departed) there will be a time of silent prayer. At the end: Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, Amen

The president introduces THE PEACE:

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us access to his grace; the peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

All exchange a sign of peace.

OFFERTORY HYMN 70

The bread and wine are brought to the altar. The president says a prayer over the gifts to which we all respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

The Eucharistic prayer follows. The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president continues the prayer, thanking God for his saving works, and then invites the people to join their praises with the whole company of heaven:

.....we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The president asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify the bread and wine, and then repeats the Lord's own words over the bread and cup. ..

.....Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again. The president continues, joining our offering with Christ's sacrifice of himself. At the end of the prayer the president says:

.....all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever:

Amen.

The President introduces the Lord's Prayer and all say together:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

We SIT or KNEEL as the president breaks the consecrated bread in pieces for all to share: We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many we are one body,

because we all share in one bread.

Jesus, Lamb of God: have mercy on us. Jesus, bearer of our sins: have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world: give us your peace.

The president addresses those who wish to come to Holy Communion:

Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

Those who wish draw near to the altar. Those who are baptized, are invited to receive Holy Communion. During communion we hear a setting of hymn 414.

When all have received Holy Communion what remains of the consecrated bread will be placed in the tabernacle and there will be a time of silence. At the end of the silence all please STAND with the President.

Let us pray.

After a short time of silent prayer. Almighty God, you see that we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves: keep us both outwardly in our bodies, and inwardly in our souls; that we may be defended from all harm which may happen to the body, and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Please join in:

All my hope on God is founded; all my trust he will renew; safe through change and chance he guides me, only good and only true: God unknown, he alone calls my heart to be his own.

Human pride and earthly glory, sword and crown betray God's trust; though with care and toil we build them, tower and temple fall to dust. But God's power, hour by hour, is my temple and my tower.

God's great goodness lasts for ever, deep his wisdom, passing thought; splendour, light and life attend him, beauty springing out of naught. Evermore from his store new-born worlds rise and adore.

Day by day the mighty Giver showers gifts on us below; his desire our souls delight in, pleasure leads us where we go. See love stand at his hand, joy awaits at his command!

Still from earth to God in heaven sacrifice of praise be done, high above all praises praising for the gift of Christ his Son. Hear Christ call one and all: those who follow shall not fall.
