The month of November begins with All Saints' Day and ends this year with the start of the new liturgical year on Advent Sunday. As an excuse to get all the red vestments out again, it has acquired the relatively recent title of 'Kingdom Season', and includes Remembrance Sunday.

From All Saints' Day, we will return to using large wafers for communion, which are broken by the presiding priest. We will also offer the chalice to everyone as they stand at the sanctuary step.

We have become accustomed now to exchanging the peace through waves and smiles rather than handshakes or hugs: this is a possible safer way to do it, especially in cold weather when social viruses are all around us. The chair layout will stay the same, with the chairs fairly spread out.

As ever, as we lead up to the new church year, if anyone is interested in participating in any ministries, they should speak to the wardens:

- Reading the Old or New Testament reading
- Leading the prayers of intercession
- Being part of the welcome team
- Making coffee and tea at the end of the service
- Being part of the sanctuary team: carrying a candle or the cross

Year A is the Year of St Matthew's gospel.
