Please be as still and quiet as possible before the service as we prepare together to celebrate the Eucharist.*

When the bell rings, please stand to join in:

**Light's glittering morn bedecks the sky;
heaven thunders forth its victor-cry:**

*The president today is the Revd Richard Young.
Please remain standing after the hymn.*

+ In the name of the Father, and of the Son
and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed, alleluia!

Jesus Christ has defeated
the powers of death.

Alleluia.

Jesus turns our sorrow into joy.

Alleluia.

Jesus has the words of eternal life.

Alleluia.

Creator of all, you wash away our sins,
**you give us new birth by the Spirit,
and redeem us in the blood of Christ.
Renew your gift of life within us,
through Jesus Christ, the risen Lord.**

May the God of love and power
forgive us and free us from our sins,
heal and strengthen us by his Spirit,
and raise us to new life in Christ our Lord.

Amen.

**Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.**

**Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ,
only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;**

**you are seated at the right hand
of the Father: receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.**

THE COLLECT The prayer for this Sunday

Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer the president says the Collect.

At the end: Amen.

Please sit down for the Ministry of the Word.

FIRST READING Acts 5.27-32

When they had brought the apostles, they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, saying, 'We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are set on bringing this man's blood on us.' But Peter and the apostles answered, 'We must obey God rather than any human authority. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Saviour, so that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.'

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

PSALM 150 *is sung by the choir*

O praise God in his holiness;
praise him in the firmament of his power;
praise him in his noble acts,
praise him according to

his excellent greatness;

Praise him in the sound of the trumpet;

Praise him upon the lute and harp:

Praise him in the cymbals and dances:

Praise him upon the strings and pipe.

SECOND READING Revelation 1.4-end

At the end:

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Please STAND for the Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia...

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia...

I am the first and the last says the Lord
and the living one; I was dead and behold
I am alive for evermore.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia...

GOSPEL READING John 20.19-end

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

*Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to John.*

Glorify to you, O Lord.

At the end:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

*Please sit down for the sermon. The preacher
today is the Revd Canon Michael Ainsworth.
After the sermon there will be a time of silence.
Then we stand with the president for the
profession of faith:*

We believe in God the Father,

**from whom every family
in heaven and on earth is named.**

We believe in God the Son,

**who lives in our hearts through faith,
and fills us with his love.**

We believe in God the Holy Spirit,

**who strengthens us
with power from on high.**

We believe in one God;

Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

*Please remain standing for the Prayer of the
Faithful. After each section:*

Lord, hear us:

Lord, graciously hear us.

*After the final section (for the departed) there will
be a time of silent prayer.*

At the end:

Merciful Father,

**accept these prayers
for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ.
Amen**

The president introduces THE PEACE:

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said, 'Peace be with you.'

Then were they glad when they saw the Lord.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

All exchange a sign of peace.

OFFERTORY HYMN 103

The bread and wine are brought to the altar.

The president says a prayer over the gifts to which we respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

The Eucharistic prayer follows.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president continues the prayer, thanking God for his saving works, and then invites the people to join their praises with the whole company of heaven:

.....for ever praising you and singing:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he
who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

The president asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify the bread and wine, and then repeats the Lord's own words over the bread and cup.

Great is the mystery of faith.

Christ has died; Christ is risen;

Christ will come again.

The president continues, joining our offering with Christ's sacrifice of himself.

At the end of the prayer the president says:

.....all honour and glory be yours,
almighty Father, for ever and ever: **Amen.**

The President introduces the Lord's Prayer and all say together:

**Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread
and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil,
for thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory
for ever and ever. Amen.**

We SIT or KNEEL as the president breaks the consecrated bread in pieces for all to share:

We break this bread

to share in the body of Christ.

**Though we are many we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.

The president addresses those who wish to come to Holy Communion:

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

Alleluia! Let us keep the feast.

Those who wish to receive the Sacrament or a blessing approach the altar. Those who are baptised, are invited to receive the sacrament. Those who are not baptised are invited to receive a blessing.



During communion the choir sings a setting of Jubilate Deo. When all have received Holy Communion what remains of the consecrated bread will be placed in the tabernacle and there is a time of silent prayer. At the end of the silence all please STAND with the President.

Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer.

Lord God our Father, through our Saviour Jesus Christ, you have assured your children of eternal life, and in baptism have made us one with him:

**deliver us from the death of sin
and raise us to new life in your love,
in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit,
by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.**

Please join in:

Rejoice and be glad!

**The Redeemer has come -
go look on his cradle, his cross,
and his tomb.**

***Sound his praises, tell the story,
Of him who was slain; Sound his praises, tell
with gladness, he liveth again.***

**Rejoice and be glad! It is sunshine at last!
The clouds have departed,
the shadows are past.**

**Rejoice and be glad!
For the Lamb that was slain
O'er death is triumphant, and liveth again.**

*PLEASE SIT for the announcements then
STAND for the blessing and dismissal.*

May God,
who through the resurrection
of our Lord Jesus Christ
has given us the victory,
give you joy and peace in your faith;
and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son + and the Holy Spirit,
be among you and remain with you always.
Amen.

Go in the peace of Christ, alleluia, alleluia:
