Deanery Reorganisation

The diocese has produced proposals for the reorganisation of the deaneries. The proposal is to consolidate the current 20 deaneries into 7 and to create a new full-time Area Dean role. The process is currently at the consultation stage and everyone is invited to give feedback. The plans and a feedback questionnaire can be found on the diocesan website. A paper copy of the plans can be found on the PCC noticeboard. The consultation period lasts until the end of February. We, along with all the churches in Hulme Deanery, would join up with Withington and Stretford Deaneries. The aim of the change is to better support existing churches at a time when the number of stipendiary clergy is likely to fall. 
