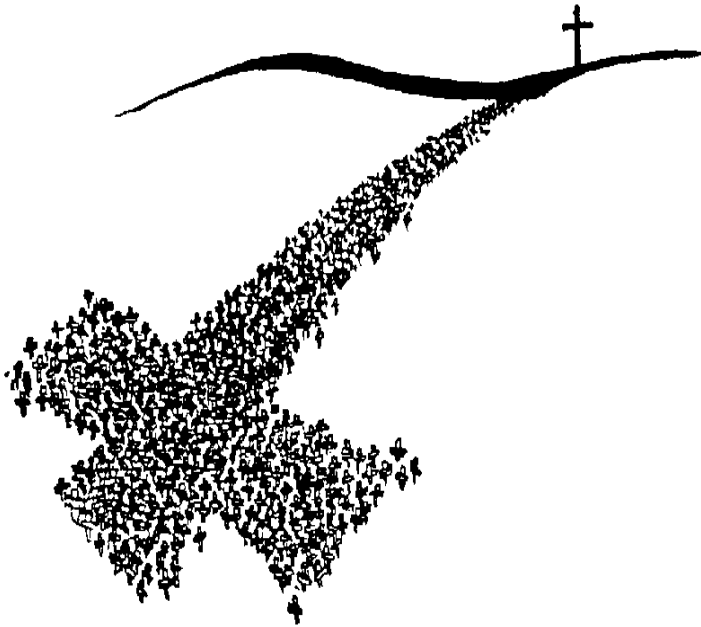

*Please be as still and quiet as possible before the service
as we prepare together to celebrate the Eucharist.*



When the bell rings, please stand to sing the first hymn as shown on the weekly insert sheet.



The president introduces the service and greets the people:

+ In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

The president invites all to call to mind their sin in these or other words:

God knows the innermost thoughts of our hearts.

In sorrow for our sin, we turn to him for mercy and for grace.

After a moment of silent prayer the president leads one of the following prayers:

Lord God, we have sinned against you;
we have done evil in your sight.

**We are sorry and repent. Have mercy
on us according to your love.**

**Renew a right spirit within us and
restore us to the joy of your salvation,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

Lord our God,
wash us thoroughly from our wickedness

and cleanse us from our sin:

Make in us a clean heart, O God,

and renew a right spirit within us:

Cast us not away from your presence

and take not your holy spirit from us.

Father eternal, giver of light and grace,

we have sinned against you

and against our neighbour,

in what we have thought,

in what we have said and done,

through ignorance,

through weakness,

through our own deliberate fault.

We have wounded your love,

and marred your image in us.

We are sorry and ashamed,

and repent of all our sins.

For the sake of your Son

Jesus Christ, who died for us,

forgive us all that is past;

and lead us out from darkness

to walk as children of light. Amen.

*The president says the Absolution, the assurance of God's forgiveness: At the end: **Amen***

The Kyries are sung:

Lord have mercy,

Christ have mercy,

Lord have mercy.

THE COLLECT *The prayer for this Sunday*

Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer the president says the Collect.

*At the end: **Amen.***

Please sit down for the Ministry of the Word. A reading from the Old Testament is followed by a setting of the psalm for the day, (shown on the weekly sheet) then a reading from the New Testament. At the end of each reading:

This is the word of the Lord

Thanks be to God.



Please stand for the Lent Gospel Acclamation:



Praise to you O Christ, King of eternal glory.

Praise to you O Christ, King of eternal glory.

A seasonal sentence is sung by the choir, and the refrain is repeated by all:

Praise to you O Christ, King of eternal glory.

This is followed by the Gospel reading:

The Lord be with you:

and also with you

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to.....

Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end: This is the Gospel of the Lord:

Praise to you, O Christ.

Please sit down for the sermon. After the sermon there will be a time of silence.

Then all stand for the Creed.

We believe in one God,

**the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.**

**For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,
was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.**

**On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.**

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

Amen.



Please remain standing for the Prayer of the Faithful. After each section:

Lord, in your mercy: Hear our prayer	OR	Lord, hear us Lord, graciously hear us

After the final section (for the departed) there will be a time of silent prayer. At the end:

Merciful Father,
**accept these prayers for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.**

The president introduces THE PEACE in these or other words:

We are the Body of Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body.
Let us then pursue all that makes for peace and builds up our common life.
The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

All exchange a sign of peace, and then join in the offertory hymn
which is shown on the weekly sheet.

The offerings of the people are collected and the bread and wine are brought to the altar.
The president says a prayer over the gifts to which we all respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER follows.

The Lord be with you :

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts:

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God:

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president continues the prayer, thanking God for his saving works, and then invites the people to join their praises with the whole company of heaven: .

.....praising you and singing:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

“Sanctus, sanctus, dominus Sabaoth, pleni sunt coeli et terra, hosanna in excelsis.
Benedictus qui venit in nomine Patris, Hosanna in excelsis.”

The president asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify the bread and wine,
and then repeats the Lord's own words over the bread and cup.

Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.	OR	Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life, Lord Jesus come in glory.

*The president continues, joining our offering with Christ's sacrifice of himself.
At the end of the prayer the president says:
.....all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.
Amen.*



The President introduces the Lord's Prayer and all say together:

<p>Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil; for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory for ever and ever. *We sit or kneel as the president breaks the consecrated bread in pieces for all to share:
We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.
Though we are many we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.*

A version of the Agnus Dei is led by the choir:

<p>Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us. Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world, give us your peace.</p>
<p>“Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, miserere nobis, dona nobis pacem.”</p>

The president addresses those who wish to come to Holy Communion:

Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world;
blessed are those who are called to his supper.
**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

Those who wish draw near to the altar. Those who are baptized, as well as communicant members of other Christian churches, are invited to receive Holy Communion. Others are asked to cross their arms for a blessing. Details of music during communion will be on the weekly information sheets. When all have received Holy Communion what remains of the consecrated bread will be placed in the tabernacle.

After a time of stillness and quiet, all please stand with the President.

Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer the president leads the Prayer after Communion.

(This can be found on the weekly sheet). Then we sing a final hymn – check weekly sheet for number. Please sit for the announcements, and then please stand for the final blessing.



May God, who from the death of sin raised you to new life in Christ,
keep you from falling and set you in the presence of his glory;
OR

Christ give you grace to grow in holiness, to deny yourselves,
take up your cross, and follow him;

....and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son + and the Holy Spirit,
be among you and remain with you always.



Amen.

Go in the peace of Christ:

Thanks be to God.

Please remain standing as the president and other ministers leave in procession.

**Refreshments will be served in church
after the service,
and all are invited to stay.**
