
Churches working together in South Manchester

#### This month's guest slot: a view from St. Chad's, Ladybarn

"During September and October were marking Creationtide at St Chad's. It seems more important than ever - pausing to be in awe of creation and Creator, and to consider our discipleship as care for creation. We'll be holding our Harvest Thanksgiving on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> September immediately followed by a short outdoor service to give thanks for and bless our Wildlife Garden and Orchard.

Our orchard has born much fruit again this year - plums, apples, and pears. It's a reminder that the city can be a place of vitality and nourishment from the natural world.

We'll also be welcoming student volunteers from Manchester University to work on our green spaces in October.

All of these activities serve to remind us not only of the goodness of God but of how interconnected with and reliant on the rest of creation we are.

Finally, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of every month we now hold an hour called "Still": a space for silent contemplation and Christian meditation. We've introduced this because of our conviction that we need to have times of stillness and silence, and not be driven

only by frenetic activity. In doing so, we may learn to notice the beauty around us, and value it in our actions."
