When the bell rings, please stand to join in:

**Holy Wisdom, lamp of learning
bless the light that reason lends.**

**Teach us judgment as we kindle
sparks of thought your Spirit sends.**

**Sanctify our search for knowledge
and the truth that sets us free.**

**Come, illumine mind and spirit
joined in deepest unity.**

**Vine of truth, in you we flourish;
by your grace we learn and grow.
May the word of Christ among us
shape our life, our search to know.
Joined to Christ in living, dying,
may we help the church convey
witness to the saving gospel,
bearing fruit of faith today.**

**Holy God, the hope of nations,
We, your Body, here on earth,
Fed by you, by word and learning,
Bread of life, and love and worth:
Shape our search for peace and justice,
Make our hearts and minds your own:
That, inspired by faith and learning,
We, your glory may make known.**

The president and preacher today is the Revd Canon Michael Ainsworth. Please remain standing for the greeting and act of penitence.

+ In the name of the Father, and of the Son
and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

God knows the innermost thoughts of our hearts. In sorrow for our sin, we turn to him for mercy and for grace.

A time of silent prayer follows, then:

God be gracious to us and bless us,
and make your face shine upon us:
Lord, have mercy: **Lord, have mercy.**

May your ways be known on the earth,
your saving power among the nations:
Christ, have mercy. **Christ, have mercy.**

You, Lord, have made known your salvation,
and reveal your justice before the nations:
Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**

May God forgive us our sins, heal and
strengthen us by his Spirit, and raise us to
new life in Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

**Glory to God in the highest, and peace
to his people on earth. Lord God,
heavenly King, almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.
Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away
the sin of the world: have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand
of the Father: receive our prayer.
For you alone are the Holy One, you alone
are the Lord, you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

the Collect.*

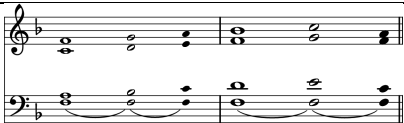
At the end: Amen.

FIRST READING: Proverbs 9.1-6

At the end: This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

PSALM 34: 9-14

O fear the LORD, you his holy ones,
for those who fear him have no want.
 The young lions suffer want and hunger,
but those who seek the LORD
lack no good thing.

Come, O children, listen to me;
I will teach you the fear of the LORD.
 Which of you desires life,
and covets many days to enjoy good?
 Keep your tongue from evil,
and your lips from speaking deceit.
 Depart from evil, and do good;
seek peace, and pursue it.

SECOND READING Ephesians 5.15-20

Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil. So do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. Do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery; but be filled with the Spirit, as you sing psalms and hymns and holy songs among yourselves, singing and making music to the Lord in your hearts; giving thanks to the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

At the end: This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Please stand.

**Bread of heaven, on thee we feed,
 For thy flesh is meat indeed;
 Ever may our souls be fed

**Vine of heaven, thy blood supplies

GOSPEL READING John 6.51-58

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Please sit down for the sermon. After the sermon there will be a time of silence. Then all please STAND with the president for the Creed:

We believe in God the Father,
from whom every family
in heaven and on earth is named.
We believe in God the Son,
who lives in our hearts through faith,
and fills us with his love.
We believe in God the Holy Spirit,
who strengthens us with power from on high.
We believe in one God;
Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Please remain standing for the Prayer of the Faithful. After each section:

Lord, in your mercy:

Hear our prayer.

After the final section there will be a time of silent prayer. At the end:

Merciful Father,
accept these prayers
for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen

The president introduces THE PEACE:

We are the Body of Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body. Let us then pursue all that makes for peace and builds up our common life. The peace of the Lord be always with you.
And also with you.

All exchange a sign of peace, then please join in:

**Hail Redeemer, King divine!
 Priest and Lamb, the throne is thine;
 King, whose reign shall never cease,
 Prince of everlasting peace.**

**Angels, saints and nations sing:
"Praised be Jesus Christ our King;
Lord of life, earth, sky and sea,
King of love on Calvary!"**

**Shepherd-king, o'er mountains steep
homeward bring the wandering sheep;
shelter in one royal fold
states and kingdoms, new and old.**

**King, whose name creation thrills,
rule our hearts, our minds, our wills;
till in peace, each nation rings
with thy praises, King of kings.**

**Eucharistic King, what love
draws thee daily from above,
clad in signs of bread and wine :
feed us, lead us, keep us thine!**

*The bread and wine are brought to the altar.
The president says a prayer over the gifts to which
we all respond:*

Blessed be God for ever.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER follows.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

*The president continues the prayer, thanking God
for his saving works, and then invites the people
to join their praises with the whole company of
heaven: their unending song of praise:*

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the
Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

*The president asks the Father to send the Holy
Spirit to sanctify the bread and wine, and then
repeats the Lord's own words over the bread and
cup.Great is the mystery of faith:*

Christ has died: Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

*THE PRESIDENT CONTINUES, joining our offering
with Christ's sacrifice of himself. At the end of the
prayer the president says:*

.....all honour and glory be yours, almighty
Father, for ever and ever:
Amen.

*The President introduces the Lord's Prayer and all
say together:*

**Our Father who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread
and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil;
for thine is the kingdom, the power
and the glory for ever and ever. Amen.**

*We SIT or KNEEL as the president breaks the
consecrated bread in pieces for all to share:*

We break this bread

to share in the body of Christ.

**Though we are many we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

**Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the
world, have mercy on us.**

*The president addresses those who wish to come
to Holy Communion:*

Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the
sins of the world; blessed are those
who are called to his supper.

**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

Those who wish to receive Holy Communion or a blessing approach the altar. All who are baptised, whether or not confirmed are invited to receive the sacrament. Those who are not baptised should cross their arms for a blessing. Children may prefer to receive only the consecrated bread. During communion please join in some verses of Take and Eat. When all have received Holy Communion what remains of the consecrated bread will be placed in the tabernacle. After a time of stillness and quiet please stand with the President.

Let us pray.

After a moment of silent prayer.

God of all mercy,
in this Eucharist you have set aside our sins
and given us your healing:
**grant that we who are made whole in Christ
may bring that healing to the world,
in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

Please join in:

**Christ be the Lord of all our days,
the swiftly passing years;
Lord of our unremembered birth,
heirs to the brightness of the earth;
Lord of our griefs and fears.**

**Christ be the source of all our deeds,
the life our living shares;
the fount which flows from worlds above
to never-failing springs of love;
the ground of all our prayers.**

**Christ be the goal of all our hopes,
the end to whom we come;
guide of each pilgrim Christian soul
which seeks, as compass seeks the pole,
our many-mansioned home.**

**Christ be the vision of our lives,
of all we think and are;
to shine upon our spirits' sight
as light of everlasting light,
the bright and morning star.**

PLEASE SIT for the announcements then STAND for the blessing and dismissal.

May Christ, who has nourished you
with himself, the true and living bread,
make you one in praise and love
and raise you up on the last day,
and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son + and the Holy Spirit,
be among you and remain with you always.
Amen.
