*When the bell rings, please stand to join in:*

**All my hope on God is founded;  
all my trust he will renew;  
safe through change and chance he guides me,  
only good and only true: God unknown,  
he alone calls my heart to be his own.**

**Human pride and earthly glory,  
sword and crown betray God's trust;  
though with care and toil we build them,  
tower and temple fall to dust.  
But God's power, hour by hour,  
is my temple and my tower.**

**God's great goodness lasts for ever,  
deep his wisdom, passing thought;  
splendour, light and life attend him,  
beauty springing out of naught.  
Evermore from his store

*The president today is the Revd Canon Michael Ainsworth. Please remain standing for the greeting and act of penitence.*

Who saves your life from destruction and crowns you with mercy and loving-kindness: Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**

May God forgive us our sins, heal and strengthen us by his Spirit, and raise us to new life in Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

**Glory to God in the highest,  
and peace to his people on earth.**

**Lord God, heavenly King,  
almighty God and Father,  
we worship you, we give you thanks,  
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,  
Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away  
the sin of the world: have mercy on us;  
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:  
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,  
you alone are the Lord, you alone are the  
Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,  
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

Please sit down for the Ministry of the Word.

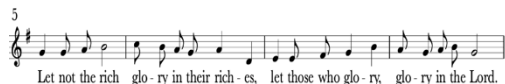
## FIRST READING

## PSALM 49.1-12



Let not the wise glory in their wisdom.  
Let not the mighty glory in their might.

let those who glory, glory in the LORD.

## SECOND READING Colossians 3:1-11

So, if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). Because of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things--anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free;  
but Christ is all and in all!

*At the end:* This is the word of the Lord.

**Thanks be to God.**

*Please stand for the Gospel Acclamation:*

## GOSPEL READING Luke 12.13-21

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

**Glorify to you, O Lord.**

*At the end:*

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

**Praise to you, O Christ.**

*Please sit down for the sermon. The preacher today is the Revd Canon Alma Servant. After the sermon there will be a time of silence. Then all please stand with the president for the Creed.*

We believe in one God,  
**the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is, seen and unseen.**  
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
**the only Son of God, eternally begotten  
of the Father, God from God,  
Light from Light, true God from true God,  
begotten, not made,  
of one Being with the Father;  
through him all things were made.**  
For us and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven,  
was incarnate of the Holy Spirit  
and the Virgin Mary and was made man.  
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius  
Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.  
On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven and is seated  
at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory  
to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.  
We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord,  
the giver of life, who proceeds from the  
Father and the Son, who with the Father  
and the Son is worshipped and glorified,  
who has spoken through the prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic and  
apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism  
for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

*Please remain standing for the Prayer of the  
Faithful. After each section:*

Lord, in your mercy:  
**hear our prayer.**

*After the final section (for the departed) there will  
be a time of silent prayer. At the end:*

Merciful Father,  
**accept these prayers for the sake of your  
Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen**

*The president introduces THE PEACE:*

We are the Body of Christ. In the one Spirit  
we were all baptized into one body.  
Let us then pursue all that makes for peace  
and builds up our common life.  
The peace of the Lord be always with you.  
**And also with you.**

*All exchange a sign of peace.*

### **OFFERTORY HYMN 355**

*‘sisters and brothers of thy dearest son’*

*The bread and wine are brought to the altar.  
The president says a prayer over the gifts to which  
we all respond:*

**Blessed be God for ever.**

*THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER follows.*

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

**We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**It is right to give thanks and praise.**

*THE PRESIDENT continues the prayer, thanking  
God for his saving works, and then invites the  
people to join their praises with the whole  
company of heaven:*

.....for ever praising you and singing:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and  
might, heaven and earth are full of your  
glory. Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the  
Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

*The president asks the Father to send the Holy  
Spirit to sanctify the bread and wine, and then  
repeats the Lord's own words over the bread and  
cup.....*

Great is the mystery of faith:

**Christ has died: Christ is risen:**

**Christ will come again.**

*The president continues, joining our offering with  
Christ's sacrifice of himself. At the end of the  
prayer the president says:*

.....all honour and glory be yours, almighty  
Father, for ever and ever:

**Amen.**

*The President introduces the Lord's Prayer and all say together:*

**Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name;  
your kingdom come, your will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us today our daily bread,  
and forgive us our sins,  
as we forgive those who sin against us.  
Lead us not into temptation  
but deliver us from evil.  
For the kingdom, the power and the glory  
are yours, now and for ever. Amen.**

*We SIT or KNEEL as the president breaks the consecrated bread in pieces for all to share:*

We break this bread  
to share in the body of Christ.  
**Though we are many we are one body,  
because we all share in one bread.**

**Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.**

*The president addresses those who wish to come to Holy Communion:*

Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world; blessed are those who are called to his supper.

**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,  
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

*Those who wish to receive Holy Communion approach the altar. During communion we sing hymn 381. When all have received Holy Communion there will be a time of silence. At the end of the silence all please STAND with the President.*

Lord God, whose Son is the true vine and the source of life, ever giving himself that the world may live:

**may we so receive within ourselves  
the power of his death and passion  
that we may share his glory  
and be made perfect in his love;  
who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.  
Amen.**
